

Liturgy Committee

Description: Works hand in hand with the clergy to prepare meaningful liturgical services for the worshipping community.

Altar Servers

Description: Altar Servers are young men and women as well as adults who assist the priest at Mass and during prayer services, baptisms, and other times when the community gathers in prayer. Servers must be 5th grade or older to participate.

Eucharistic Minister

Description: This group of commissioned and trained ministers distributes Communion at Mass and brings Communion to the home-bound. Eucharistic Ministers serve as an integral part of the communion of faith which defines the Body of Christ.

Homebound

Description: This committee visits or calls the homebound to offer assistance or take communion to ill, aged or injured parishioners. If you like to talk to people, sign up for this committee.

Hospitality/Usher

Description: Greet and assist people before mass, help with collection, direct communion, and distribute bulletins at the end of mass, and make each visitor and new member feel welcome.

Lectors

Description: Lectors are parishioners who read the Scriptures, petitions and announcements at Sunday and weekday Masses.

Music

Description: “Come let us sing joyfully to the Lord: cry out to the rock of our salvation. Let us greet Him with a song of praise, joyfully sing out our psalms.” (Psalm 95: 1-2) The music ministry is eager to provide quality leadership through music that encourages complete participation of the congregation in sung prayer. Divine Mercy

Description:
